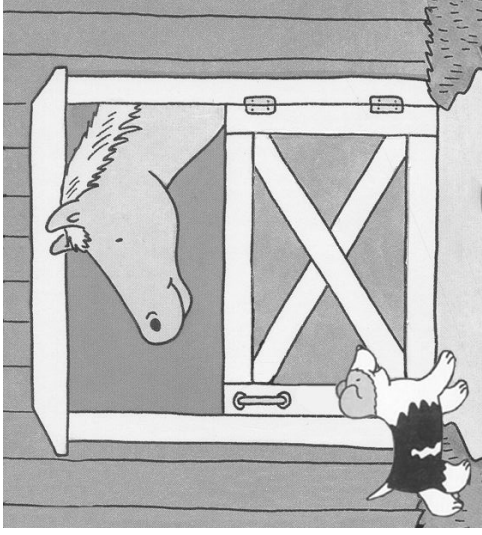

General Information

Days & Hours: Monday through Friday, 9:00 am - 4:00 pm. We also offer early drop off from 7:00 am and late pick up until 6:00 pm at no additional charge.

Transportation: PHC does not provide transportation. Children will be released to a non-family member only with written permission from a parent or guardian.

Lunch: Campers should bring a complete lunch. Cold drinks, bottled water and snacks are available from our vending machines, and fresh drinking water is available from our water fountain.

Equipment: A certified horseback riding helmet (must have ASTM/SEI approval sticker) manufactured after the year 2000 is required. Such helmets are provided by PHC at no charge. Other safety requirements include long pants and flat-soled boots with 1/2" shelf heel. Please send your child with a change of clothes for the afternoon, including sneakers and clothes that may get dirty during barn and other recreational activities. For safety's sake! NO riding will be allowed in sneakers or short pants.

Terms: Reserve your place with a registration fee of \$100 (non-refundable after May 1st) for each week of camp you're attending - by cash or check (payable to Potomac Horse Center, Inc.) or with a credit card payment in person or by phone, and complete our **Camp Participation Agreement and Liability Waiver**. The final balance is due according to the terms of your contract in order to guarantee your reservation. Discounts: Sibling discounts are offered at the rate of 5% for the first additional sibling; 10% for a second additional sibling. Multiple week discounts begin with the third enrolled week and are already figured into the tuition chart above.

Health Requirements: If your Camper attends a Maryland school, all that is required is the parent or legal guardian's completion of our camp contract, and a current tetanus inoculation. Maryland law requires that Campers not attending school in-state complete a Form 896, which is available through a link on our summer camp webpage or on paper from our office by request.
